
uBICo Retreat in Engelberg – November 3–4, 2025

On November 3rd and 4th, members of uBICo from the Department of Biomedicine (DBM) and the Biozentrum convened in the scenic mountain town of Engelberg for the annual uBICo retreat. Surrounded by snow-capped peaks and crisp alpine air, participants gathered to reflect on progress, strengthen collaborations, and shape the scientific and strategic direction of the consortium for the coming years.





The retreat brought together researchers across all levels- from trainees to principal investigators -creating a dynamic and open environment for exchange. The scientific program featured 16 trainee presentations, covering an impressive range of topics that highlight uBICo's interdisciplinary approach to immunology. Talks spanned key areas including *Immunometabolism & Inflammation*, *Cancer Immunology*, *Systems Immunology*, and *Allergy & Host Defense*, showcasing the breadth of expertise and innovation within the network.

Complementing these talks, participants took part in a poster walk on the first day, during which each member presented their research and received constructive feedback from colleagues. The format encouraged informal discussion, networking, and cross-fertilisation of ideas - a reflection of uBICo's commitment to collaborative science and mentorship.

A particularly engaging moment of the retreat was an evening discussion between PIs and trainees, which focused on the future of biomedical research and the evolving landscape of immunology. Topics included the potential of artificial intelligence in medicine, the next frontiers in immunological research, and the importance of integrating insights from different disciplines. The open dialogue provided valuable perspectives on how emerging technologies and interdisciplinary approaches can accelerate discovery and translation, while also strengthening connections across the uBICo community.

This year's retreat also marked the first attendance of new group leaders, *Jean Christophe Beltra* and *Mariana Borsa*, who were warmly welcomed by the community. Their participation brought fresh perspectives and added momentum to ongoing and future collaborative efforts.

Adding a fun and light-hearted element to the scientific program, participants enjoyed an Immunology-focused quiz, which tested their knowledge in a friendly and competitive setting. Congratulations to the winning team - Anna Salamero Boix, Ira Pillai, Jean Pieters, and Yagmur Farsakoglu - the second-place team - Francesc

Baixauli, Elena Ratti, Vanshika Rastogi, and Claire Depew - and the third-place team -Javier Pareja, Irene Fusi, Joelle de Vaan, and Franziska Bosch - for their enthusiastic participation and impressive performances.
